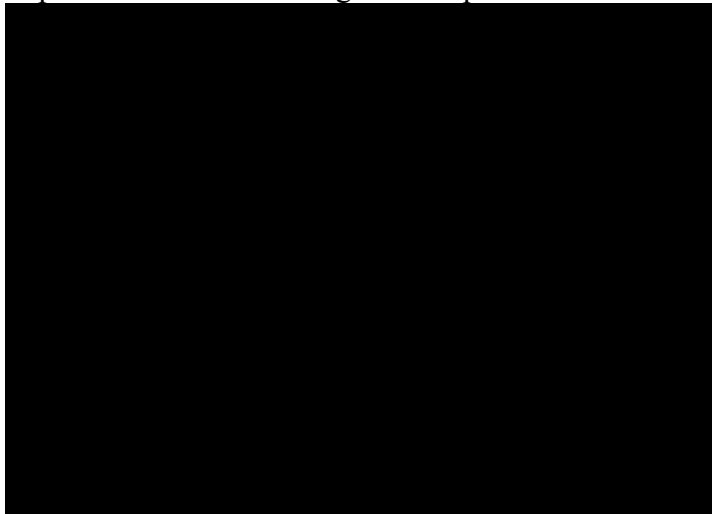
Seize the Day: Get involved!
